Fire Protection Technology Program : Conservative Placement

Rate: Defined as “% of respondents who earned an undergraduate degree and are employed full time in their chosen field, or in a position that requires a degree, or they are continuing their education”.

* Note: All students must complete a required internship to graduate. Therefore the number of graduates and those that participated in experiential learning is equal. The term “experiential” learning may have confused respondents as it is listed as an “internship”.

A majority of the Fire Protection students go on to complete the “step-up” bachelor degree in Emergency Management & Homeland Security. They chose to defer their graduation until they complete the bachelor degree, at which time they apply for both the Associate & Bachelor degrees.
