 - Skeeles Field
- Conducted research on each donor and collected photographs of each space and donors
- Developed a website landing page featuring pictures of the space to click and learn more: https://uakron.edu/development/landmarks/
- Created individual QR codes for each sign.
 - When individuals scan a QR code they are redirected to a detailed webpage
 - The detailed webpage shares the space's story, donor pictures, and benefit to our campus community
- Updated the Department of Development landing page to direct visitors to the UA landmarks + green space page: https://uakron.edu/development/
- Designed park-like signs, identifying the named space with the QR code
- Coordinated with Physical Facilities for the production and sign installation.
- Designed a campus map, specific to this project, identifying each location
