John Huss called the meeting of University Council's Institutional Advancement Committee (IAC) of The University of Akron (UA) to order at 9:03am. Mr. Huss sought approval of the Agenda for the 1/13/23 meeting. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. He next sought approval of the Minutes (second revised copy) from the 12/9/22 meeting. The motion was seconded and passed unanimously. Kim Cole presented on the UA Dept. of Advancement's Return on Engagement (ROE) model. Within the model are four main areas that are highlighted during alumni social events:

- 1)Recruitment of prospective students
- 2)Community/Initiative Building
- 3)Fundraising
- 4)Career Services – matchmaking and networking

Of 180,000 UA alumni across the world the bulk are in Ohio. In consideration of resources, the Alumni team focuses a great deal of effort to identify where the largest population and most critical alumni reside, pinpoint quality host venues, and create key events in order to capitalize on ROE.

The following have been identified as critical cities for 2023: Akron, Cleveland, Cincinnati, Columbus, Atlanta, Charlotte, Los Angeles, Washington DC, Houston, Tampa, and Naples.
